In August 1914, the outbreak of World War I was experienced as an adventure. Given the horrors of the trench warfare this perspective soon became impossible. Instead of telling adventure stories, authors like Thomas Mann and Robert Musil begun to consider dreams of adventure as a possible key to understanding the state of mind before the war.
